I have asked Kerry County Council to repair this part of the road and I will continue to push the Council on this.

### **Railway Road**

I would like to thank Derry Murphy, owner of Super Valu for his help with providing space for the pedestrian crossing on Railway Road. Great credit is due to Derry for offering up their land at no cost to the Council.

It is vital for children's safety that the pedestrian crossing will be installed and I will continue to push Kerry County Council to have it constructed as soon as possible.

Also, I have asked the Council as part of their traffic management plan for the area, to look at installing traffic calming measures on this road.

There have been a number of accidents and near misses in recent times and with the recommencement of the school year I am hopeful that the council will ensure that these new measures I've proposed will be installed as soon as possible.
